BASIC LEADER TRAINING

The basic leader training program is designed to provide an overview of the entire Scouting program and how each component of the program works into the next. Basic Leader Training gives new leaders the tools necessary to provide a quality, fun-filled program that helps Scouts easily graduate through the ranks quickly while having fun. It begins with Fast Start Training, continues through New Leader Essentials, and is followed by Leader Specific training tailored for each adult’s role in the unit.

OVERVIEW

Fast Start Training

Fast Start training is the first step for any new volunteer and is to be delivered immediately after a new leader registers and before he or she meets with any youth members. Fast Start Training is available online at www.cvcbsa.org under Training at bottom left.

Basic Leader Training

Basic Leader Training is comprised of two parts: *New Leader Essentials* for all unit-level leaders and *Leader Specific Training* based on the leader’s unit-level position.
